In a surprise move yesterday, Federation president Thug Thompson announced his resignation and his plans to run for re-election in the election called for June 2nd. Thompson who leads a minority CRG government is expected to parlay that vote into a majority, provided the polls are correct on election day.

The opposition motion limiting the increses in ice-cream prices to 6%, instead of the 8% wanted by the government, was cited by Thompson as an example of the obstruction tactics of the Free and Democratic Party (FDP). Thompson said that the FDP was a dangerous element on council, and that it was time for the voters to reafirm its confidence in the CRG.

FDP leader Dave Cotter charged that Thompson had "engineered" the election, and wanted a majority even though his mandate would not end until February 1978. Cotter promised that his party would base its campaign on pressing issues such as environmental quality, citing the harsh living conditions experienced by some of the people living in the lower areas of the Campus Centre.

The third party, the Quite Frankly party, was in disarray after the resignation of their leader Parry Wiley. Their campaign got of to a poor start when interim leader Sam Haggar was prevented from campaigning at Food Services, because he forgot to ask prior permission.

The only thing yet agreed upon in this election has been a debate format. The three leaders have agreed to hold a debate in the Mathsoc C&D Lounge co-moderated by Neil McDocherty and Gerrry Crudence.



Mathsoc voted to ask the Federation to delay its refundable fee referendum until the fall term. The motion outlined Mathsoc's belief that the students should decide in a referrendum, what kind of fee they would pay. It went on to state that the actions of some Engsoc officials were causing disunity amongst the students, and that the refundable fee issue should be decided in the fall, when more people are around and a more rational decision could be made. The motion is actually an amended version of a much stronger motion. Some councillors felt that the original motion contained too many personal attacks against Peter King, and thus itself could be a cause of student disunity. Those possibly derogatory words were deleted, and the amended motion was passed unanimously.

After last term's absence in the real world, your reporter has returned to the virtual world of UW (you could say we are all paged out here on a swapping drum).

PULSE

IBM has gone about making the work of your average systems programmer quite a bit easier than it was in earlier OS days. They have developed a large data base containing the definition of load modules present in the various operating system components. Cross referenced with this are source module CSECTS and macros. A utility program called System Modification Program (SMP) manipulates this data base, and allows the user to define his/her own "mods" or Program Tem-porary Fixes (PTF) as IBM terms them (they have an acronym for everything). Along with user defined PTF's, the systems programming staff in our in-stallation receives a 6250 BPI tape full of PTF's for system maintenance every month (the PTF's on the last tape we received required at least nine-and-a-half hours of HANDS-ON test time for verification according to the cover letter). This would indicate that a large number of bugs are continually being found. The idea behind this program - data base is that all changes to the operating system and components are logged through this program. As well, back-ups of system source are kept in "distrubution libraries". When a change is made and then placed in the running copy of the operating system then the utility gives the programmer a chance to recover quickly from the back-up source, should the change be faulty. Another nice feature is that a change to a macro used in more than one system module will cause all modules that use it to be re-assembled and re-linked into the appropriate system libraries.

All in all quite a useful tool.

IBM has announced a new processor in their SYSTEM 370 line, the 3033. It is reputed to be between 1.6 and 1.8 times faster than the former top of the line model 168. The different model number has caused a number of people to speculate that this new hardware is the CPU for IBM's "FUTURE SYSTEM" running an emulator program for a 1370.

CSC Wants YOU!

APLsauce

Well, here's a *new* column, which 'WILL',((?2)- $\Box IO$) /' NOT' be a regular thing. APL is the basic subject, although you'll find that I may \rightarrow ? $\lfloor /\iota 0$ at times.

One often heard criticism of APL is that it does not force programmers to write structured programs (although they can if they want to). It is unfortunate that many APL programmers take advantage of this to write unreadable code ('Betcha you can't figure out what this does!'). Since unreadable code is generally unmaintainable code, APL is sometimes resisted in commercial environments. One paper presented at the APL76 conference held in Ottawa in September (and reprinted in Datamation in March) gives a solution. The author, Ephraim MacLean of UCLA, proposes that APL programs be small, have a clearly- defined function, and pass data only as program arguments or results. Then, when a modification is required, the affected programs are thrown away and new ones are written from scratch!

Prof MacLean calls his idea 'throwaway andelt works because of the high speed of APL coding and because programmers are not forced to write code in set ways. It wouldn't work in any other language!

One of the papers at the APL76 conference was presented by Maria Tavera of the IBM Madrid Scientific Centre, whose knowledge of English, though good, was not quite complete when it came to idiomatic expressions. At one point someone asked her a question which she didn't understand, and she apologized for this, saying that she was a foreigner and sometimes had difficulty with English. Al Rose (co-author of APL: An Interactive Approach) spoke up: 'Don't be embarrassed; the only foreigners in this room are the COBOL programmers!'

As we start another term at Waterloo, we find Neil and the boys of Free and Democratic Publications still producing their paper in Federation space. While Doug Wahlsten gets his day in court in June, the Federation's eviction proceedings have yet to come to trial.

At this time a number of options can be pursued. By force or through the courts the Federation can try to regain its office space.
