

# **MEF - Call for Funding Proposals** and Funding Council Members

The Math Endowment Fund (MEF) is currently soliciting funding proposals for the Fall 2010 Term. MEF is an endowment fund operated by the math student body with the mandate of funding projects that improve undergraduate mathematics education. One of MEF's primary goals is to give back to math students through the funding of various initiatives. To meet this objective, MEF finances projects such as the purchase of new club office equipment, the purchase of CSCF computer servers, math orientation, and the attendance of conferences (ex. travel expenses and registration fees). Here are more details if you are interested in submitting a proposal:

#### **Funding Proposals**

The deadline for submitting a proposal for the term is midnight on Wednesday, Nov. 10<sup>th</sup>, 2010. Submit proposals online at http://www.student.math.uwaterloo.ca/~mefcom/proposals by clicking the green "Go to online funding proposals application" link. Copies of the funding proposal are also available for download in .pdf and .doc. However, we require that all proposals be submitted electronically.

#### **Funding Council Positions**

There are also student positions available on the Funding Council. The student positions are voting members of the Funding Council and only need to attend one meeting this term during the late afternoon to early evening of Tuesday, Nov. 16<sup>th</sup>, 2010. At the meeting, the Funding Council listens to presentations by and critiques the proposals of the groups requesting funding. Afterwards, the Funding Council votes on how much funding should be allocated to each proposal. Dinner and refreshments are provided.

Funding Council members are needed for both year reps (3 per year) and for program reps (2 per program). Nomination forms can be found in .pdf and .doc formats, and are due by Wednesday, Nov. 10th, 2010 to the MEF Office (MC 3050).

# Warrantless Wiretapping Bill in front of the House of Commons Again

The Conservative government, as well as the previous Liberal government, clearly do not care about our civil liberties. http:/ /www.cbc.ca/politics/story/2010/11/01/justicenicholson-justice-isp.html details the introduction of two new bills as follows:

The Investigative Power for the 21st Century Act would:

- Allow police to identify all network nodes and jurisdictions involved in data transmission and trace the communications back to a suspect.
- Force ISPs to keep data temporarily so that it isn't lost or deleted before law enforcement agencies return with a search warrant or production order to obtain it.
- Make it illegal to possess a computer virus for the purpose of committing a criminal offence.
- Enhance international co-operation to help Canadian authorities investigate alleged crime that goes beyond its borders.

Its partner, the Investigating and Preventing Criminal Electronic Communications Act, would:

- Force ISPs to install interception systems in their networks, making it easier for law enforcement or national security agencies to intercept information.
- Provide police with "timely access" to personal information about subscribers, including names, address and internet addresses, without the need for a warrant.

These powers are a slap in the face to the privacy of all Canadians, as warrantless gathering of data is against the entire concept of due process, and goes against the spirit of Section 8 of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms, the right against unreasonable search and seizure. What especially disgusts me is the hypocrisy of this government, allowing for such a bill that curtails the privacy of Canadians when previously they defended the ending of the Long Form Census on the grounds of the privacy of a small number of individuals.

I urge all of you who care about your privacy to begin encrypting your internet activities immediately, to prevent the government, and any unsavoury individuals who wish to peek on your actions. I also strongly urge all of you to write to Peter Braid, the local Conservative MP, expressing your disagreement with this proposed bill. 

We ended up playing the game for around 7-8 hours nonstop. We did not complete 100% of the game, but we finished the main story mode. The game consisted of three different teams of two, since you can play this game in co-op.

The team with the best teamwork did something the others didn't: actually work together - and work together well, in fact. *Kirby's Epic Yarn* has no lives; instead, when you die or take damage, all the collectible gems you picked up end up flying out of you (sort of like Sonic's rings). Oddly enough, for a game where you can't die, we were motivated to get a gold medal in each level by collecting a large number of gems. This team got odd scores, ranging from bronze to gold (second worst to best). Prince Fluff, the co-op character in the game, also has the same abilities. Boss fights were fun and memorable, especially the last fight. They were challenging (remember, fire hurts), and again, even though you couldn't die, it was a trial to get platinum medals on them. The gameplay, in short, was solid and fun. It provided difficulty to hardcore players, but was simple enough for novice players to pick up and play.

The game has a weird, hilariously narrated story. Not meant to be taken seriously, it perfectly followed the style of the Kirby series, playing jokes on itself. I don't want to spoil the "story", since Kirby has never been all about stories, but it's enjoyable to listen to and it doesn't feel like something slapped on to explain why the game is as it is.

My favourite part of *Kirby's Epic Yarn* was the final world, where they remixed many of the older Kirby music. This made my heart leap for joy.

Overall, the game is a buy, even for something as short as this. The question then is whether you prefer a short, high quality game to a longer game. If you want quality, then definitely pick up *Kirby's Epic Yarn* for the Nintendo Wii.



What this does is simply starts an instance of the function and pipes it into another instance of the function, then puts the whole thing into the background so it can't be stopped by killing the parent process. The last bit is simply a semicolon ending the line, followed by a colon (the name of our function) which invokes the function, starting the fork bomb. As you can see, each invocation creates two more invocations of itself, for an exponential increase in the number of processes running, until things start crashing because of a lack of memory or process numbers. The best cure for this is to reboot the machine.






